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# I. Introduction

297 (13.1%) males and 59 (2.5%) females with a 5:1 male-to-female ratio, with Lungs being the second-most aberrant among males and 10th among females, were afflicted by lung abnormalities. # Lung cancer can be classified into several stages, including:

**Stage I:** Cancer cells are exclusively seen in the lungs and have not migrated to lymph nodes. The tumor is around 3 cm in diameter.

**Stage II:** Cancer cells have spread across the lung and surrounding lymph nodes. The tumor is between 3 cm and 7 cm in size at this stage.

**Stage III:** Cancer cells appear in the lungs and lymph nodes in the center of the chest at this Stage. The tumor has grown to a size of more than 7 cm at this point.

**Stage IV:** This stage of cancer is extremely deadly and incurable. Cancer cells are at this time disseminated to the lungs or to a different area of the body, such the liver or another organ.

# II. Methodology

# Image Pre-Processing

In the first place we resize the picture since the different sources of pictures are different. 1. Spatial Domain Method

Techniques for improvement are based essentially on histograms, as it is extremely easy and quick. We can achieve some application that we desire with acceptable outcomes. This approach emphasizes and sharpens picture characteristics including edges, borders and contrasts, so that graphical data may be easily viewed inside the image. We utilized the Median filter for improvement.

# **Median Filter**

To minimize picture noise, the median filter is a highly helpful and successful approach. This filter identifies edges; first, the noise in the picture should be eliminated, and then the edges should be removed. The median filter's primary function is to reduce noise while leaving edges intact. Average filter is also used to reduce noise, however because the average of pixels in the window replaces the mid pixel intensity, some data is lost. So, for noise removal, we utilized the Median filter. As with the linear Gaussian filter, the median filter is a smoothing method.

The median filter's primary concept is to run each input and replace it with the median of surrounding pixels' intensity entries.

The "window" refers to the arrangement of neighbors. The most evident window for a 1D signal is only the first few preceding and following entries, but more complicated window patterns are available for 2D (or higher-dimensional) pictures.

# **Binary Image Processing**



Dilation, erosion, opening & closure are the four basic morphological processes. We utilized opening and shutting in this example, and in order to do so, we must first grasp dilation and erosion morphological procedures.

# **Binarization Approach :**

The approach of binarization depends on the fact that in a normal pixel we start counting the black pixel to normal and abnormal images to get an average number later on as a threshold if there are more Black Pixels in a new picture than the threshold, otherwise the image will be normal if the pixels of a new image are greater than the threshold if it's average, otherwise it's t normal. The threshold for the research was 17178.48, with the true rate of acceptance (TRA) being(92.86%) and the fake rate of acceptance (FAR) being (7.14 percent ).

**Binarization Check method Flowchart** 




#### Thresholding:

The colour patterns of HSL and HSV are increasingly often employed, and because the hue might be a circular number, circular thresholds are required.

#### Masking Approach :

The masking technique hinges on the fact that masses appear in ROI (lungs), as they increase the percentage of malignancy. The appearance of solid blue colors is normal, whereas RGB masses show the presence of cancer, TAR is (85.7%) and FAR is (85.7%) (14.3 percent ).


Figure below illustrates typical and aberrant pictures that come from MATLAB implementation.




Fig: 2 Region Growing of the Gabor Filter Image
