An Analysis Of Lecturer's Language Style Through Whatsapp Chats By Using A Pragmatic Theory

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Abstract

The purpose of this study is to describe the language style used by the writer when communicating with her lecturer through the Whatsapp application. It is expected that give some knowledge about language, especially the theory of pragmatics in communication between students and lecturers through the media Whatsapp social media, so that there are no deviations in its use. Type of research used in this mini research is qualitative research. Content analysis method carried out in dense documents contained in the text. While the content of communication is the message contained as a result of communication that happened. The object of this research is the content of writer's communication or speech that sent via Whatsapp (WA) to UNILA Bandar Lampung Lecturers in Master of English Education. The data is taken from the Whatsapp application. Data collection techniques in this research are documentation and note-taking technique. In the data obtained that there are some responses from lecturer in short utterances and sometimes used such emoticon or symbols to the writer as the student. Speech begins with greetings to start conversation. Then proceed with an apology with a sentence and introduce before making her point. Even in the use of words and patterns, correct, the choice of the right and appropriate standard words. Then end with greeting closing.

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I. Introduction

Language is the main tool in communication and has great informative power. Language is needed by humans because with language humans can find their needs by communicating with each other. According to Erlinda (2019) pragmatics is related to the study of meaning based on some factors such as speaker meaning, contextual meaning, listeners inference and even the expression. In addition, Yule (1996) defines pragmatic is needed if we want a fuller, deeper, and more reasonable account of human language behavior.

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II. Literature Review

In linguistics and related fields, pragmatics is the study of how context contributes to meaning. There are some types of pragmatics.

1) Deixis

Huang (2007) explains that deixis directly concerned with the relationship between the structure of a language and the context in which the language is used. Yule (1996) asserts that deixis can be defined as "pointing via language". Any linguistic form used to accomplish this 'pointing' is called deictic expression— sometimes it is called indexicalls

2) Reference and Inference

Reference is defined as a thing that speaker says or writes that mentions something or somebody else (Oxford Advanced Learner Dictionary, 8th Edition). Yule (1997) defined it as an action in which communicator utilizes a linguistic forms in order to direct listeners into identification of something.

Reference and inference is a concept on how meanings are expressed by speaker through linguistic expressions and later being inferred (interpreted) by the listeners. The expressions used to deliver the meaning are not always explicitly state the thing which been referred, a meaning behind the meaning.

3) Presupposition

Presupposition can be simply defined as an inference. In this case, Huang (2007: 65) explains that presupposition whose trust is taken for granted in the utterance of a sentence. Its main function is to act as a precondition of some sort for the appropriate of that sentence.

4) Implicature

Mey (1993: 99) states that conversational implicatures refers to something which is implied from a conversation, that is, which is left implicit in actual language use. Moreover, the utterance will

have default interpretation. In addition, Yule (1996: 40) explains that in the case of generalized implicatures, special knowledge the context of utterance is not required in order tomake the necessary inferences.

5) Speech Act

Speech act is the usage of language to accomplish something. Actions performed via utterances are called speech acts (*e.g., apology,complaint, compliment, invitation, promise, and request*). The speaker normally expects that his or her communicative intention will be recognized by the hearer—both speaker and hearer are helped by the circumstances surrounding the utterance. (Erlinda: 2019)

6) Politeness

Politeness can be defined as a desire to protect self image. Erlinda (2019) stated that a speaker must show awareness of the hearer's face and self image through various strategies. It means that to besuccessful in interaction, one has to follow some important strategies be polite. In this sense, politeness can be accomplished in situations of social distance or

closeness. Showing awareness for another person's face when that other seems socially distant is often described in terms of respector deference (Yule, 1996).

In a second-language setting where the target language is commonly spoken outside of the classroom, pragmatics instruction may best capitalize on exercises that encourage learners to study the language as used authentically in the community.

III. Method

Type of research used in this mini research is qualitative research. Content analysis method carried out in dense documents contained in the text. While the content of communication is the message contained as a result of communication that happened. 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The lecturer's language style contains directive speech act which can be seen from choice of words used. Speeches that speaker intends the students to do something.

The lecturer's language style contains expressive speech act which can be seen from choice of words used. Lecturer expresses feeling and attitude about supporting or giving good response.
